IPA Zambia Presents at Evidence for Impact Symposium

From March 20-22, the Zambian Ministry of Health with support from LEARD, DRIC, and Proplation Council, consened the first national Evidence for Impact, research symposium. The theme of this year's symposium was "Translating Research into Gains in Primary and Community Health in Zambia." The focus of the symposium was on regrod utcle, maternal and newborn, child, and adolescent Health and nutrition services (BMNCAH-N) in primary care and community settings. The symposium showcasted research conducted at all levels of policymaking and service delivery from community to national levels.

The symposium conversed government agencies, public and private research institutions, development partners, UN agencies, the scientific community and nethenis, academia, civil society organizations, community based organizations, and includical researchers. Over 300 participants attended. IPA participated in a plenery session focused on the process of translating research into policy and programs. The parel came to a consensus on the importance of ensuring co-mailton of evidence to guarantee ownership of research results; engaging policymaleser, researchers, and end users at all stages of research; and ensuring that research utilization is integrated from the start. The discussion also highlighted the importance of going beyond research dissemination to research utilization and building capacity in research skills and knowledge translation techniques in all relevant institutions (i.e., experience).
