Zambia Bulletin:

IPA Zambia Presents at Evidence for Impact Symposium

From March 30-32, the Zambian Ministry of Health with support from USAED, DHD, and Population Duncit, convented the first national Evidence for Impid: research symposium. The theme of this years symposium was "rhearbing Research into Gains in Primary and Community Health in Zambia," The focus of the symposium was on reproductive, maternal and newborn, child, and adolesionst health and nutrition services (RMNCAH-N) in primary care and community setting. The symposium showcased research conducted at all levels of policymaking and service delivery from community to national levels.

The symposium convened government agencies, public and private research institutions, development pattners, LN agencies, the scientific community and networks, academia, chil society organizations, community-based organizations, and individual researchers. Over 300 participants attended. IPA participated in a plenary tession focused on the process of transisting research reto policy and programs. The parel Came to a consensus on the importance of ensuing consection of evidence to guarantee ownership of research nesult; engaging policynaiser, nesearcher, and end uses at al stages of nesearch, and end uses at al stages of nesearch, and ensuing that nesearch utilizations incognised from the start.
