<u>School-based deworming</u> is one of the most cost effective methods for raising school attendance. In areas where prevalence is high, worms make children weak and makes them miss days of school. And the more we learn the better deworming keeps sounding, as new research is suggesting long-term impacts of deworming children on <u>cognitive development</u>, and even on wages once those children are grown and entering the labor market.
